# Stephen Toulmin (1912-1984)



- ◇ born in London; active in WWII - tech research and intelligence
- ◇ **key interests:** the philosophy of science, the philosophy of law
- ◇ *The Uses of Argument* (1958)
- ◇ develops a ***theory of practical reasoning improving on formal logic***
- ◇ *not a rhetorician...* but a profound influence on US rhetoric, communication scholars





# Communication

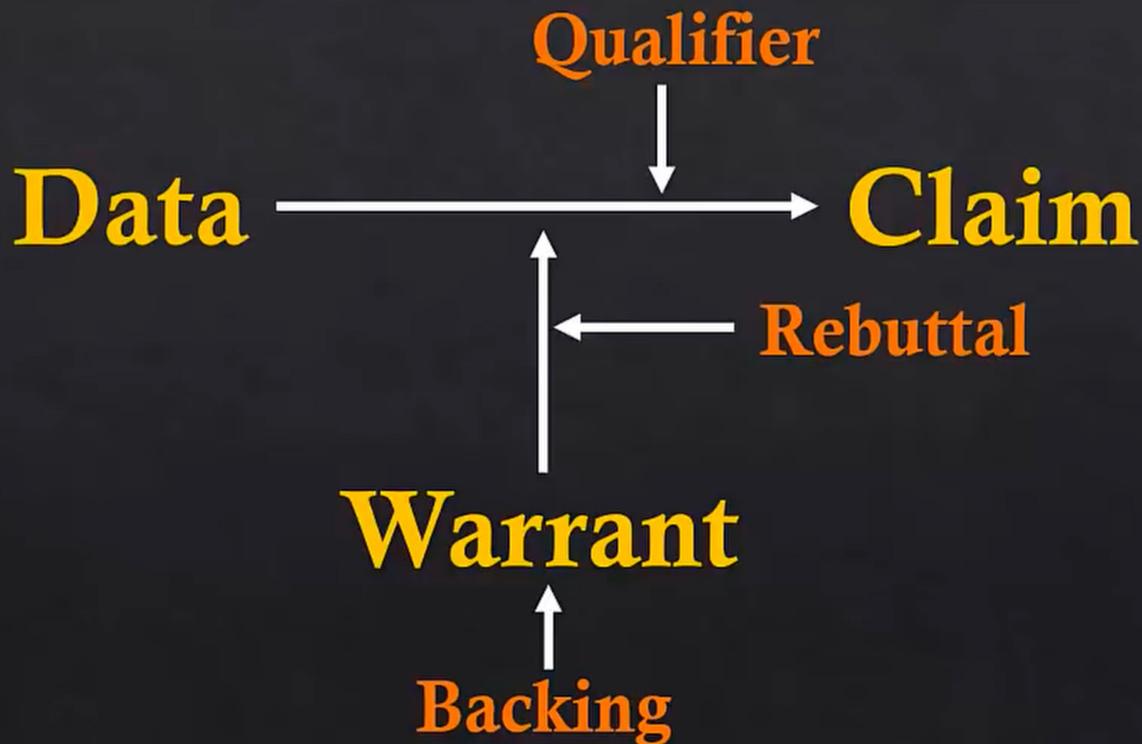
Syllogism:

**Premise 1:** All humans are mortal. (Major premise)

**Premise 2:** John is a human. (Minor premise)

**Conclusion:** Therefore, John is mortal

# Toulmin's Model of Argument

**Claim**

- **Step 1 - Claim:**

The claim is the main point or assertion that you are trying to persuade your audience to accept



# Toulmin's Model of Argument

*“why is the  
conclusion true?”*

**Data**



**Claim**

*“the conclusion I  
want you to draw”*

- **Step 2 - DATA (Ground):**

The DATA are the evidence or reasons you provide to support your claim.



# Toulmin's Model of Argument

*“why is the conclusion true?”*

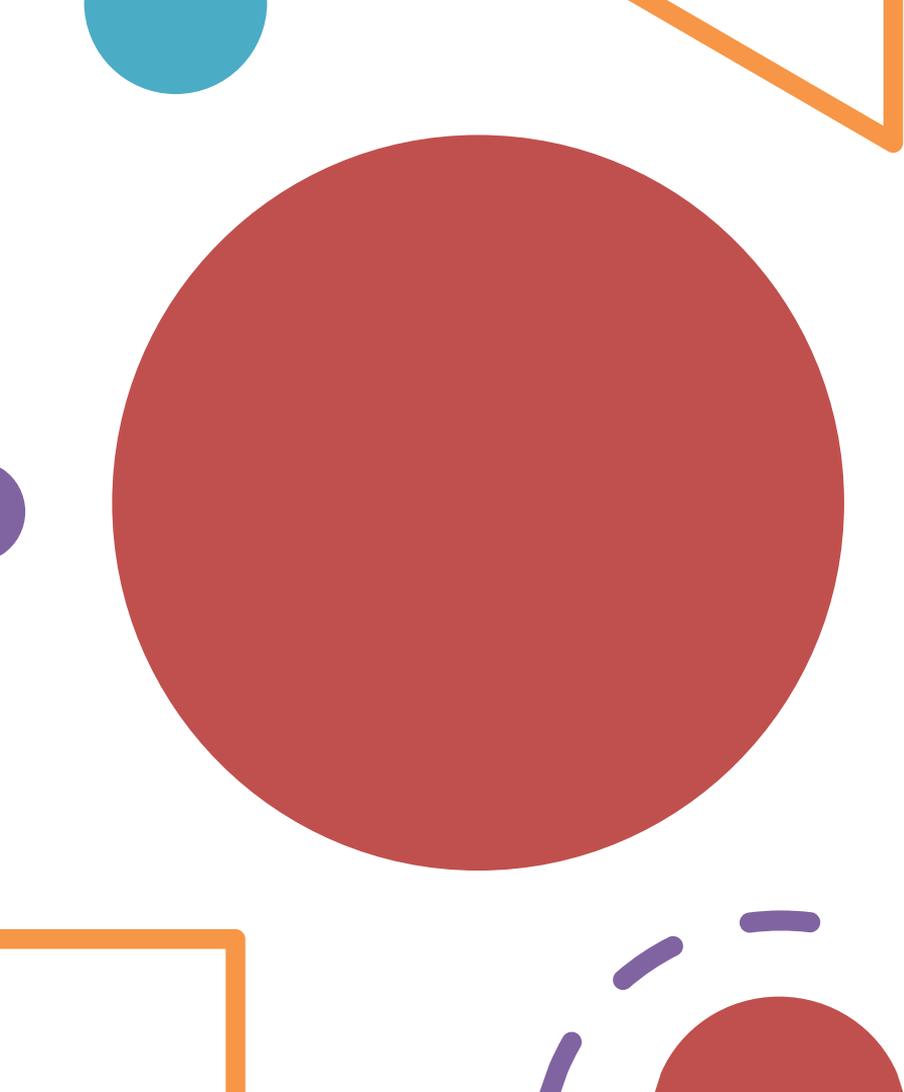


**Claim**

*“what’s the link?”*

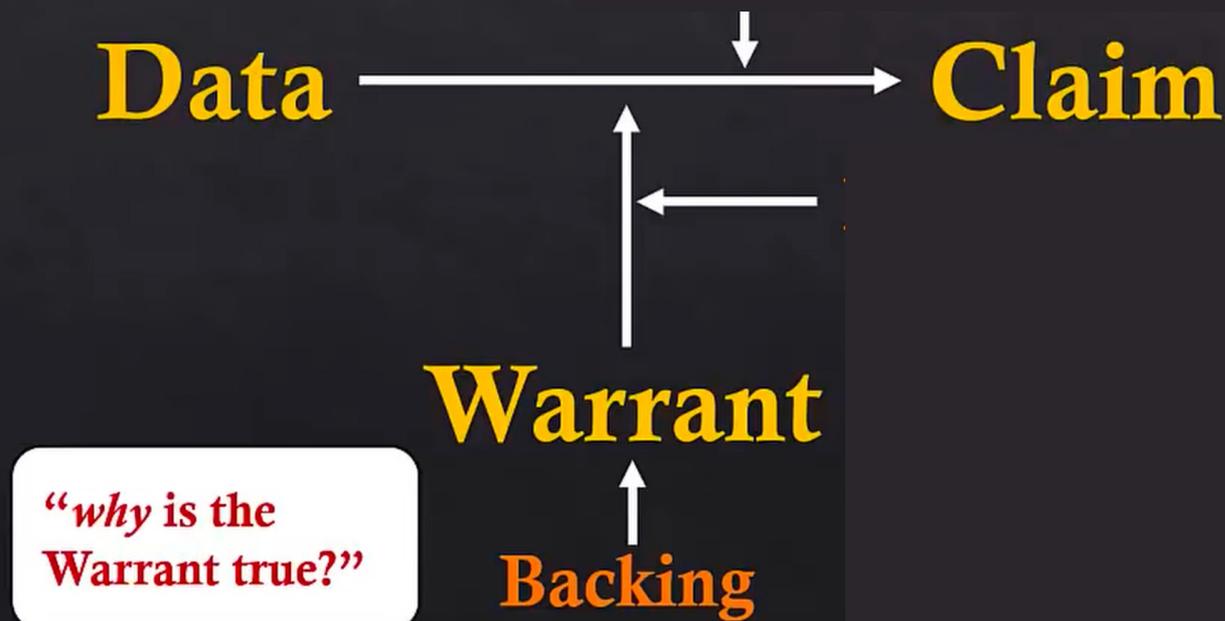
**Warrant**



- **Step 3 - Warrant:**

The warrant is the logical connection between the claim and the grounds. It explains why the evidence supports the claim.

# Toulmin's Model of Argument

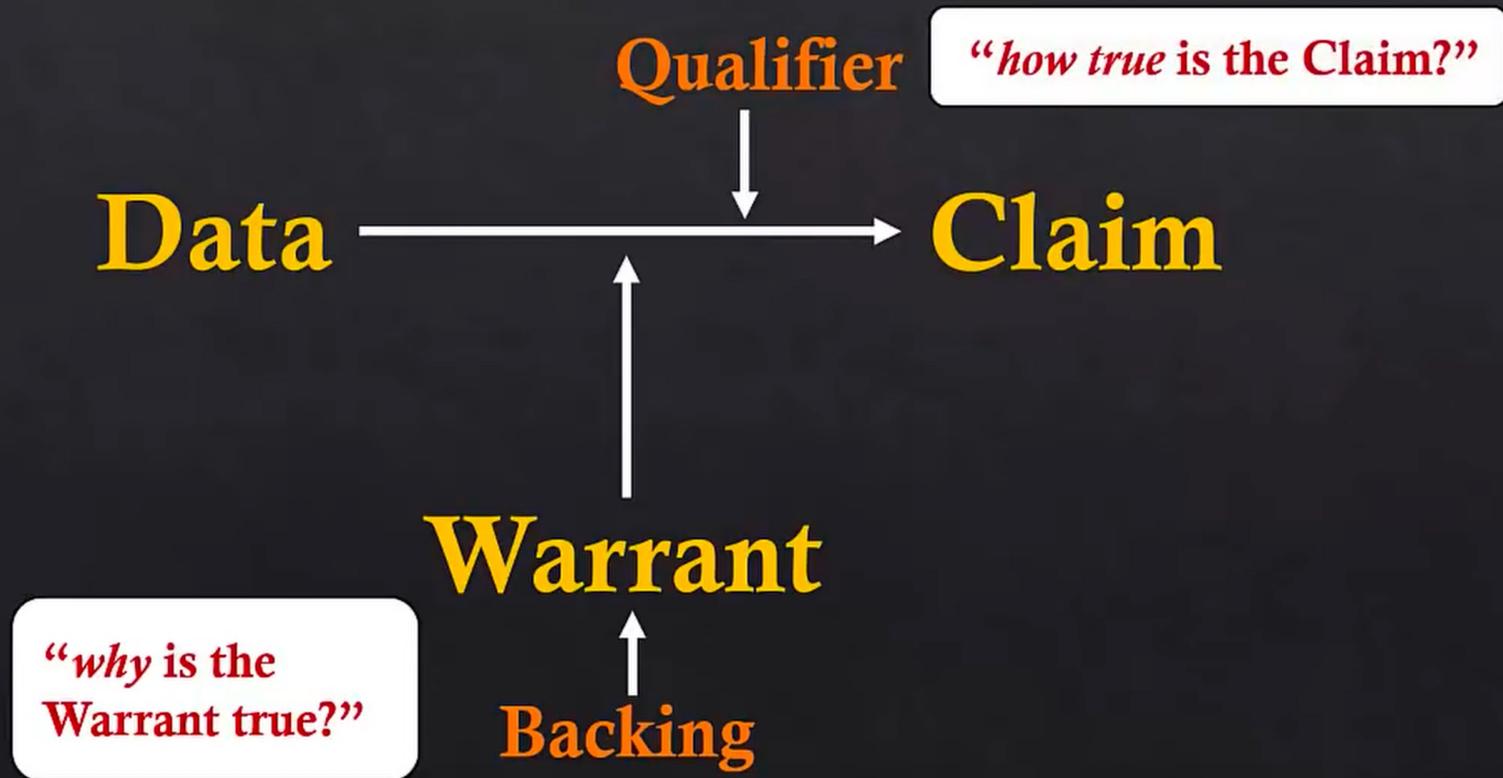


- **Step 4 - Backing:**

The backing is additional support or evidence for the warrant. It reinforces the logical connection between the data and the claim.



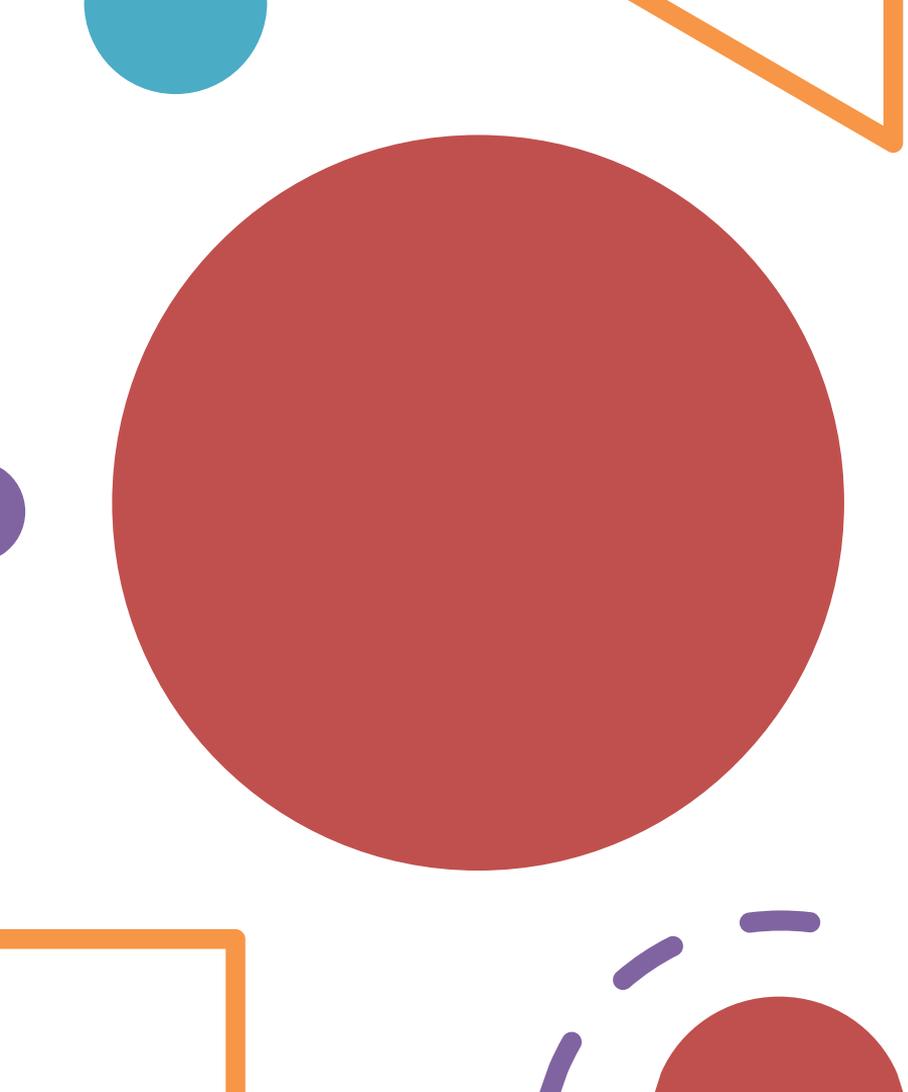
# Toulmin's Model of Argument



- **Step 5 - Qualifiers:**

Qualifiers are the statements that indicate the degree of strength or certainty of the argument.

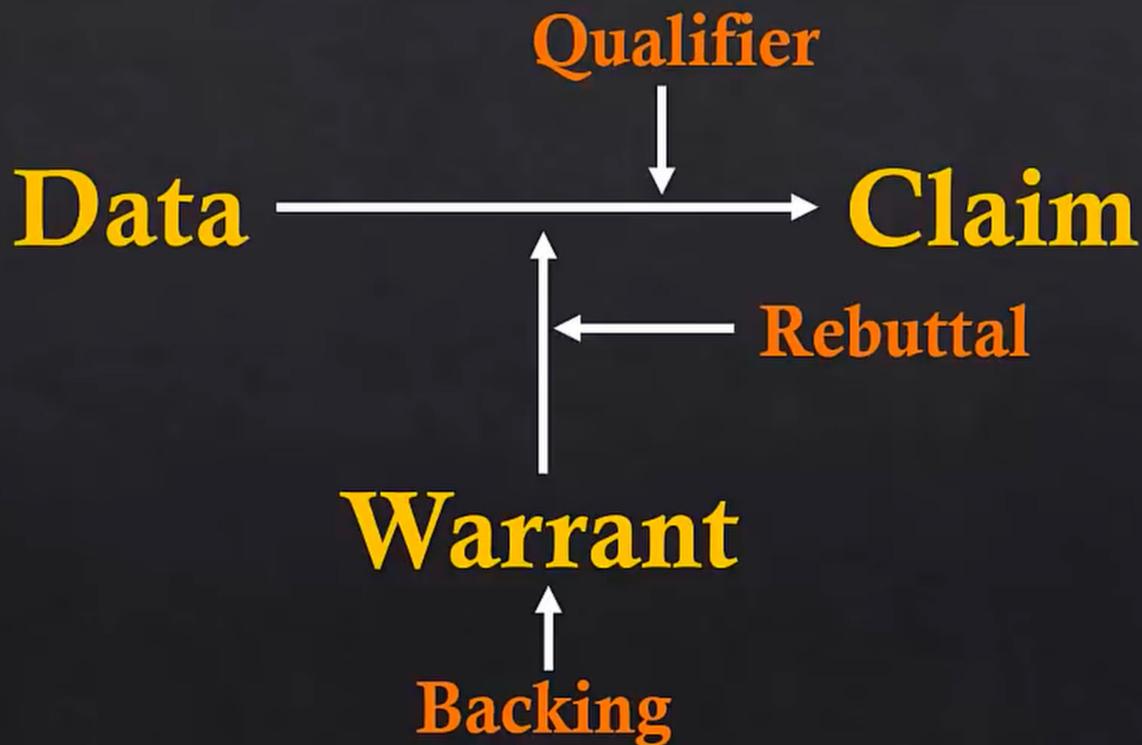


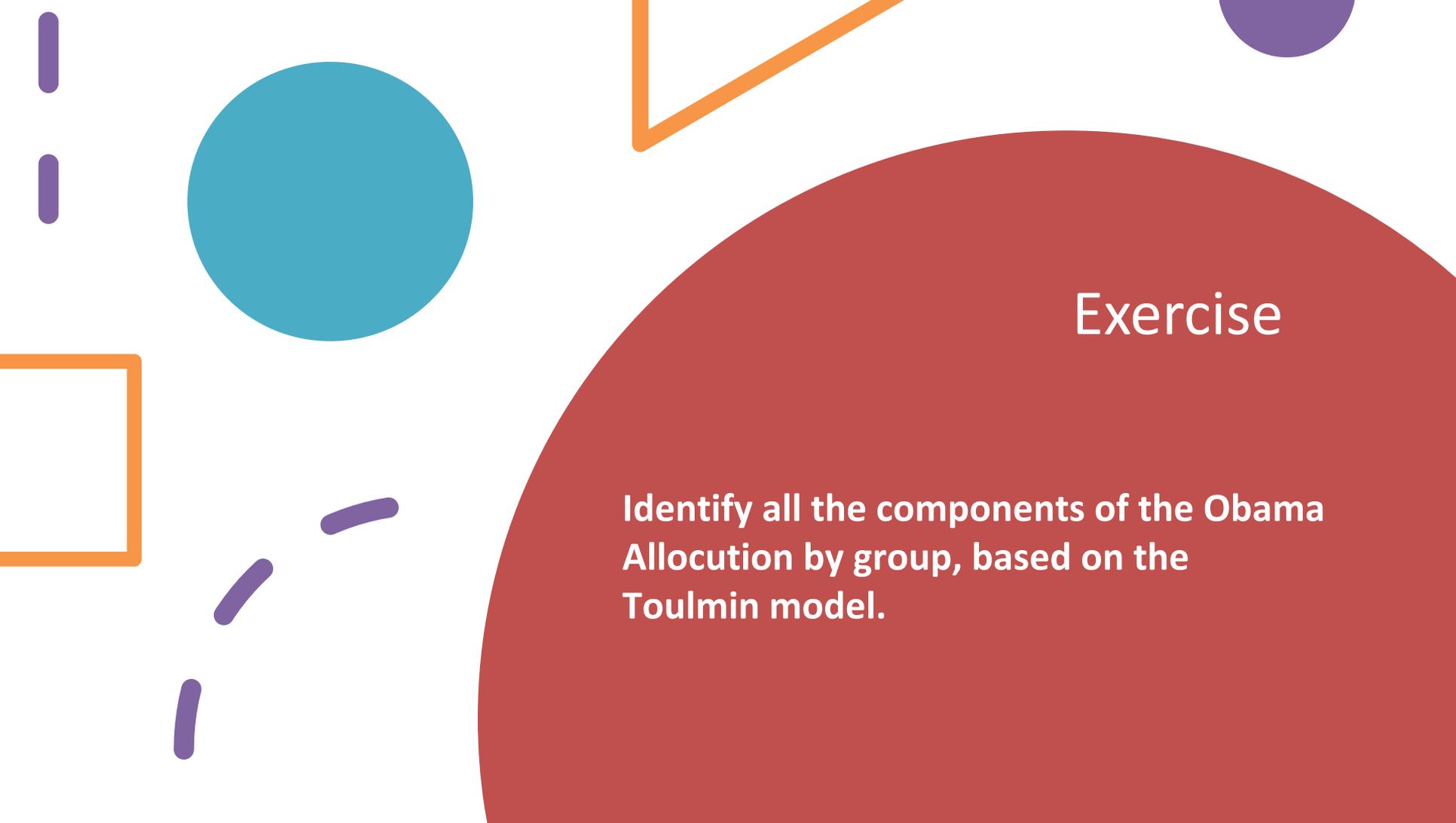


- **Step 6 - Rebuttal**

A rebuttal is the component of the argument that introduces counter-arguments or objections that the audience may potentially consider

## Rhetorical questions

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A rhetorical question is a question that is not expected to be answered, used for rhetorical purposes to highlight an obvious point or to reinforce a viewpoint
